

ROBSTOWN INDEPENDENT SCHOOL DISTRICT 2008-2009 STUDENT DRESS CODE

Adopted by RISD Board of Trustees March 18, 2008

STUDENTS MUST BE IN COMPLIANCE WITH THE DRESS CODE ON THE FIRST DAY OF SCHOOL.

All students attending Robstown ISD schools will be required to wear the following:

- Shirts**
- A Solid-color red, white, dark blue, dark green, or yellow polo, oxford or turtle neck
 - A polo shirt is defined as a long or short sleeved knit button-down shirt with a collar and longer than the natural waistline. (No snaps, zippers or logos)
 - Shirts may be worn untucked provided they are not longer than the split of the pants. Longer shirts must be tucked inside the pants.
 - Midriff must not be visible when hands are raised above the head.
 - Solid red, white, dark blue, dark green, yellow, black and gray undershirts may be worn under a student's shirt.
 - Campus/Spirit/Club/Organization/Athletic shirts may be worn on designated dates set by the campus principal.
- Slacks**
- Blue denim jeans, navy or khaki pants, walking shorts, skirts, skorts or capris
 - **Pants and shorts must be worn on the waist and are not to sag or fit baggy.**
 - Clothing may not be more than 4 inches above the knee.
- Jackets**
- Parents/students are expected to use good judgment when choosing appropriate winter outerwear
 - Hoods may not be worn inside the school building or classroom
- Clothes shall be worn to the appropriate size for each student.
 - Appropriate under garments shall be worn at all times.
 - Appropriate shoes must be worn at all times.
 - Students' hair shall be clean, neat, and well groomed in appearance. The only facial hair allowed will be mustaches which shall be clean, neat and well groomed in appearance.
 - Hats and caps may be worn only on days designated by the campus principal.

NO LOGOS or LABELS WILL BE ALLOWED ON CLOTHING

THE FOLLOWING ARE PROHIBITED:

- Tight or revealing clothing
- Visible body or tongue piercing excluding the ears
- Rosary beads worn outside the shirt or blouse
- Bandanas and towels
- Students' hairstyles which represent extremes that may disrupt or distract from instruction
- Sunglasses unless they are prescribed by a physician
- Chains on wallets
- Distracting cosmetic contact lenses
- Trench style coats
- Any spiked accessories

The entire staff will enforce the dress code. Students in violation will be sent to the office. **(RISD reserves the right to exclude any items of clothing or jewelry deemed distracting and/or dangerous to the educational process.)**

- The principal or designee has the authority to require belts when necessary.
- Students must make every effort to conceal visible tattoos.
- The principal, in cooperation with the sponsor, coach, or other person in charge of an extracurricular activity, may regulate the dress and grooming of students who participate in an extracurricular activity. Students who violate these standards may be removed or excluded from the activity for a period determined by the principal or sponsor and may be subjected to further disciplinary action. (Students must adhere to the rules and constitutions of the extracurricular activity.)
- Students assigned to the DAEP (Disciplinary Alternative Education Program) may have specific dress code guidelines not addressed above.

Dress Code Violation Consequences

1. Students who are not in compliance with the dress code will have an opportunity to correct the problem or call their parents. Students will be placed in ISS until the parent can bring them a change of clothes.
2. The student will be placed in ISS.
3. Persistent and defiant violations of the dress code will result in an out of school suspension and/or DAEP Placement.

THE SUPERINTENDENT/SUPERINTENDENT'S DESIGNEE/ PRINCIPAL/ASSISTANT PRINCIPAL HAS THE AUTHORITY TO MAKE A RULING ON ANY CONTROVERSIAL DRESS CODE ISSUE IN QUESTION.
